RECYCLING

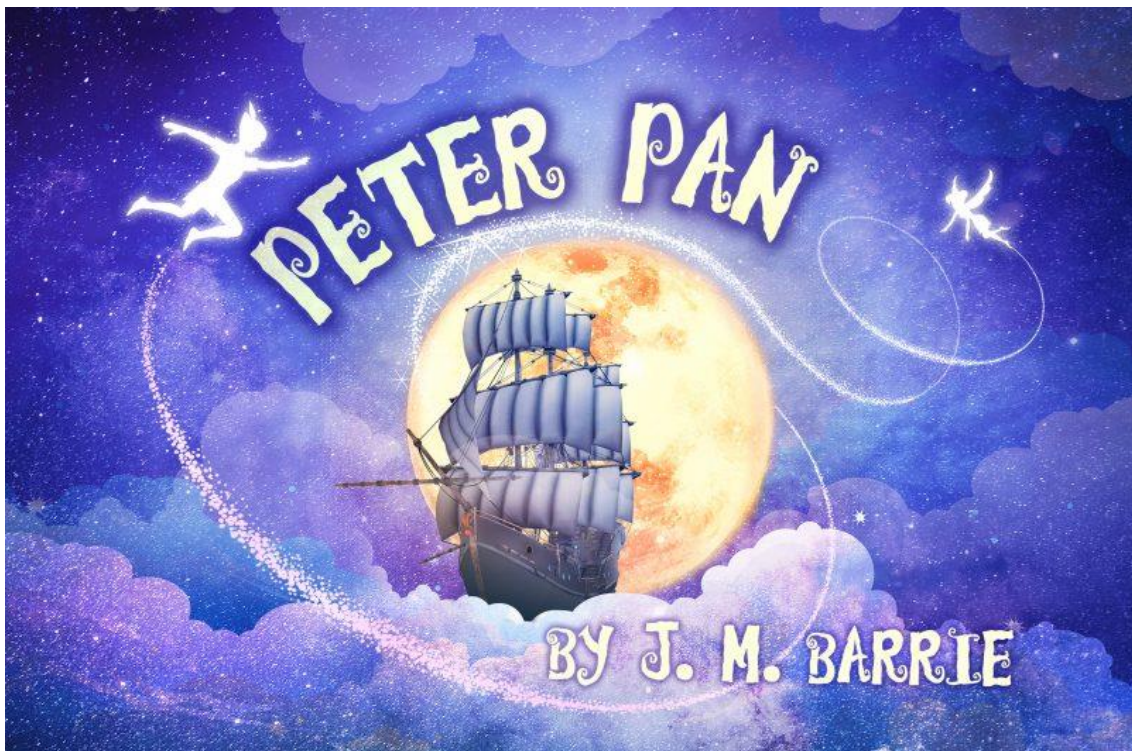
As part of the Gateway Award scheme students are encouraged to get involved in a recycling project. At Access we have since been inspired by this and have decided to do more of our own recycling!
